

#### A MASTER PLAN **IS**:

- A conceptual framework that provides direction & flexibility
- Comprehensive and long range (10-20 years)
- A planning instrument
- A vision that balances needs + desires with site character and function



#### A MASTER PLAN IS NOT:

- A guide for park construction
- A design document
- Static
- The result of ONE person's idea










## Project Team Organization Structure





- Opportunity for education demonstration with Neighborhood Ecology Corps (NEC)






## **Wetlands Inventory**

- Summer inventory scheduled for July 2017












- Five Key Themes:

  - Perception of Safety



Cay Creek Wetland Interpretive Center has a 15 foot tower that provides a wetland experience from multiple viewpoints.

## Community Needs Assessment Survey

- 92 Responses
  - 80% of responses are Raleigh residents
- Access:
  - 85% access by vehicle
  - 25% access by bike
  - 23% access by walking

  - Diverse demographics and interests
  - Community representation

## CPC Purpose - Why are You Here?

Provide recommendations to the Raleigh Parks, Recreation and Greenways Advisory Board (PRGAB) for a future park program that will best meet the needs of the community

- Discover, share information, and learn from each other
- Develop, review, and discuss program elements
- Shape agreements that resolve issues and balance multiple interests
- Inform the public and the City about topics addressed in the process

#### **Your Final Products**

- Program Statement that describes the overall vision for the park and serves as the foundation for a range of Plan Alternatives
- Draft Master Plan that includes a conceptual plan rendering, Program Statement, background information, and recommendations for environmental stewardship of the park
- Priorities for phased development of the project, with consideration for existing and anticipated funding
- Proposed Plan based on public feedback of the Draft Master Plan

## Your Responsibilities

- Deliberate in Good Faith balance interests and participate in a consensus building process
- Represent Constituents when reviewing issues and recommendations
- Attend Meetings and fully participate in each meeting



## **Consensus Based Decision Making**

 Consensus decision-making is a group decision-making process in which group members develop, and agree to support a decision in the best interest of the whole.




#### **Your Consensus Choices:**

- 1. Endorsement (Member fully supports it)
- 2. Endorsement with minor point of contention (Member likes it)
- 3. Agreement with minor reservation (Formal disagreement, but will not block or hold up the proposal/provision)
- 4. Stand aside with major reservations (Formal disagreement, but will not block or hold up the proposal/provision)
- 5. Block (Member will not support the proposed plan)


## Measuring Consensus:

- Consensus = All committee members present rate the proposal as a 1,2, or 3
- Consensus with Major Reservations = All committee members present rate the proposal as a 1,2, or 3, expect at least one Committee member rates it as a 4
- No Consensus = Any committee member rates the proposal as a 5



#### **Ground Rules**

- Only one person will speak at a time and no one will interrupt when another person is speaking
- Each person will express his or her own views rather than speaking for others at the table
- No one will make personal attacks or issue statements blaming others for specific action or outcomes
- Members will avoid grandstanding (extended comments and questions) in order to allow everyone a fair chance to speak and to contribute
