  - Seeking opportunities for project integration




# Key Steps in Developing a Project

- City Projects
  - Design/Public Involvement
  - Right-of-Way Acquisition
  - Construction
- Federal/State Projects
  - Environmental Analysis/Public Involvement (NEPA/SEPA)
    - Environmental Impact Statement/Record of Decision
    - Environmental Assessment/Finding of No Significant Impact
    - Categorical Exclusion
  - Design
  - Right-of-Way Acquisition
  - Construction







## Prioritization by Category

### Streetscape Improvements

- Prioritization Updated in 2013
- Top Projects:
  - Hillsborough Street Phase II
  - Oberlin Road
  - Hillsborough Street Phase IV (Cameron Park)
  - E. Cabarrus Street
  - New Bern/Edenton Corridor
  - Salisbury Street
  - Wilmington Street



## Transit Corridor Projects

- Transit Technology Study
  - RFQ will be released shortly
  - Will recommend transit investment options for priority corridors identified in Comprehensive Plan
- New Bern BRT Project recommended by staff
  - Highest performing transit corridor in CAT system
  - High priority for economic investment
  - Compliments future transit investments by TTA



#### Street Projects

- Projects identified based on area/corridor plans, public input, Council input and staff input
- Over 100 projects evaluated
- Which projects should the City reasonably consider within a 10-year period?


# Street Project Prioritization

- Data collected and compared for major and minor street projects
- All modal data considered equally
  - Congestion (volume/Capacity)
  - Crash Data
    - Automotive, Bicycle & Pedestrian
  - Bike Plan Priority
  - Pedestrian Plan Priority
  - Transit Benefit
- Economic Development areas not prioritized, but bonus awarded to projects in scoring

# Street Project Prioritization

- Ranking in each category established
- Sum of rankings by project type
  - Lower score indicates projects ranking highly in multiple categories
- Economic Development Bonus
  - 10 points for projects adjacent to ED areas
  - 25 points for projects substantially within ED areas

#### **New Streets**

- The City has periodically undertaken "new location" projects
- No existing data, not all future streets have been modeled for traffic volumes
- Simplified to three criteria:
  - Benefit to transit?
  - Within an economic development area?
  - Directly benefits a parallel facility?

# **Corridor Planning**

- Projects prioritized based on Council input and staff suggestions
  - Areas with emerging issues or special needs
  - Locations recommended by 2030 Comprehensive Plan
- Normally prioritized as part of annual work plan review
- Corridor plans have great value outside of capital funding process
  - Shapes development patterns
  - Dictates infrastructure installation by private development



# Resurfacing Program

- \$10 Million allocated from previous bond as a stopgap measure
  - Needs to be established in CIP as a more reliable pay-go fund
- Funding target = \$12 Million per year



# NCDOT Project Cost Sharing

- Sidewalks (50%)
- Bike-related improvements
- Greenway improvements
- Betterments
  - Upgrades to finishes
  - Wider sidewalks
- Other street improvements not required by base project
  - Interchange alterations





## **Active NCDOT Projects**

- I-440 Widening
- US 70 Widening
- Eastern Wake Expressway
- Aviation Parkway Extension (Feasibility Study)
- Southeast High Speed Rail
- Capital Boulevard Bridge Replacements
  - Peace Street
  - Wade Avenue
- Avent Ferry/Lake Johnson Bridge Replacement
- Trailwood Road Bridge Replacement



#### **NCDOT** Projects

- Participation by City guaranteed by Municipal Agreement
  - Funds must be encumbered by City prior to entering into the agreement
- Large number of bridge projects will be challenging to match
- Funding target = \$10 Million over four years
  - set aside as a flexible reserve
